

IT'S ALL ABOUT THE ESSAY

A STRONG ADMISSIONS ESSAY WILL SET YOU APART.

o amount of studying can help you nail the college essay. Maybe that's why, in a 2015 survey of 14,000 high-

school students, nearly half said that the most challenging part of the admissions process wasn't taking tests but writing the essay. With many colleges going test-optional, essay writing has taken on even greater importance. It's all too easy to procrastinate on writing these short personal statements (they're typically only 500 words), but if done right, your essay can make your application shine far more than good grades can. We asked a few college-admissions essay experts to share what they look for, and, more importantly, what students should avoid. Here is a short list of what they say are the most common mistakes, as well as some tips on how to write a compelling essay—no matter where you apply.

MISTAKE #1: GENERIC SUBJECT

TYPICAL TITLES: The Big Performance; A Sports Injury; My Mission Trip

UNIQUE TITLES: My First Flight Failed, But My Love Was Born; My Grandma's Kimchi; Where I'm Home (from Ethan Sawyer, the "College Essay Guy")

Admissions counselors read through thousands of essays each year, most of which cover a narrow range of subjects and themes. While there are engaging ways to write about common topics, Margot Starbuck, author of *Writing College Application Essays That Shine*, points to originality as the most important aspect of a strong college essay.

"There are two key things you want your essay to do," she explains. "One is to share a unique story that only you could have written. The other is to reflect on the meaning of that story in a way that gives the reader a glimpse into what makes you, you."

Since many popular college essay topics are something you can list in the extracurricular section of the application, Ethan Sawyer, also known as the "College Essay Guy," urges his students to spend time

listing out potential experiences that show, not tell, who they are.

"I think the key to having a great personal statement is doing awesome brainstorming," he says. "Focus on uncommon topics, or make uncommon connections that show what you care about."

Sierra Kinslow, assistant director of admissions at Messiah College, tells her students to consider what sets them apart from their friend in the same class who might participate in the same activities. While she encourages students to talk about their spiritual journey, Kinslow says it's important that each writer personalize their faith and show how they will contribute to conversations on campus.

"We see a lot of generic essays about growing up in a Christian home or going to a Christian school," she says. "The good ones are from students who don't have a traditional faith experience or students who have really grappled with their faith."

MISTAKE #2: SLOW START

BEFORE: Being the captain of the high school volley-ball team was one of the most impactful experiences of my life. I was a pretty bad player when I started, but through hard work and perseverance, I became a starter in my sophomore year. My favorite part of it was helping new players hone their technique. I even helped lead our team to win the state championship my junior year!

AFTER: The photo is old and faded, but when I hold it up close to the light, the details come to life. There's my grandma standing outside her college dorm, smiling and holding a worn-out volleyball. It was taken right before her accident that prevented her from ever playing again. Every time I look at the photo, though, I can see the same joy on her face that's on mine whenever I step out onto the court.

The original opening does a good job of giving the reader an idea of what the essay will cover but does little to convince someone to keep reading. "It's important that the first couple of sentences draws us in and gets us invested in the story and how it's going to play out," says Kinslow.

Before even getting started, Sawyer suggests students brainstorm not only unique essay topics but how to grip the reader from the get-go and keep them engaged throughout. Here are a few successful strategies he suggests:

 Raising a question or a problem that will be answered or solved later

- "The Hemingway," or opening with an imagebased description that sets the scene
- "The Trailer," or opening with a moment of high tension that gives a sneak peek of where things are headed

MISTAKE #3: LACK OF FOCUS

BEFORE: Outside of school, I was very involved in other extracurricular activities. Every other weekend I would help my church pack bags of groceries to drop off for local families in need. I also went on a mission trip in ninth grade with my church to Mexico where we built a basketball court for an orphanage. At school, I was consistently top of my class and was the vice president of the National Honors Society my senior year.

AFTER: Growing up in a middle-class home, I never truly understood what it was like to wonder where your next meal was going to come from. Then, one day, I heard my pastor at church ask for volunteers to help pack and deliver food to underserved families on weekends. I'm not a great chef, but I had two hands and a car, so I showed up the next Saturday eager to help. I'll never forget the first delivery I made.

The first lists information about the student's accomplishments, but Starbuck urges students to avoid using their essay as a short autobiography and instead focus on a single story and theme.

"This isn't the part of the college application where students should be listing their achievements," she says. "It's best to give a little slice of your life. It doesn't need to be something spectacular like being a backup dancer for Beyoncé or jumping out of an airplane. Maybe you have a passion that nobody else in your class has, or there's a social issue that you're really invested in and have taken steps to change."

MISTAKE #4: SETTLING FOR FINE

BEFORE: In conclusion, because of my strong mix of academic and extracirricular experience, I think I'm the perfect fit for state College. I hope youll accept me and I thank you for this opportunity to express my qualifications.

AFTER: On the plane ride home, I flipped through my journal entries from the trip so I wouldn't forget the people who took me in and showed me real community. I knew that I was returning home changed, with a whole new perspective on how all it takes is one small step to make a big difference, whether at home, in your community, or on campus.

Perhaps nothing throws up a red flag on a college essay faster than grammatical errors. Missing punctuation, misspelled words, and awkward sentence structure are all easy fixes, but Kinslow says people may be surprised by how many essays clearly need a second look.

"Having someone proofread it is so important," she says. "Another set of eyes reading through it can help you make sure that things are making sense."

Struggling with getting started? Even the best wordsmiths get writer's block. Luckily, people have been writing college essays for years, and many of the best ones have been posted online as resources. Instead of twiddling your thumbs, Starbuck suggests reading both good and bad essays and making a list of specific techniques that you can use in your own piece, like closing on a powerful

takeaway instead of a short summary as in the above example.

"I tell students, 'Don't just read one essay—read 10 or 20,' and it tends to get the creative juices flowing," she says.

Crafting a memorable college essay is not easy. And not everyone has gone through a life-changing experience or overcome some huge obstacle before college. That's okay. Here's the last and maybe most important thing to remember: You have a story to tell. Sometimes it's the small, less obvious moments of your life that speak the most to who you are.

"Don't feel like you have to write about a challenge," Sawyer says. "You don't need one to write a great story and demonstrate the awesomeness of who you are. The college essay is your canvas. You can paint whatever you want."








CHANGES EVERYTHING







pportunities for sport and recreation abound on college campuses.

Did you start on your high school's vol-

leyball team? Join an intramural league. Interested in kickball, even though you've never played outside of recess? It's easy to find a pickup game. From major national pastimes and adventure sports down to wild and wacky Zombie vs. Alien tournaments and Quidditch leagues, you'll never be hard-pressed to find competitive and recreational options on campus.

DON'T FORGET TO HAVE FUN

Of course, not everything has to be a competition. Outdoor adventure sports like biking, kayaking, and hiking can be a fun group activity, a personal challenge, or simply a change of pace. Many campuses have a recreation department that coordinates group outings and activities.

If you're new to a sport, your campus might offer lessons to learn this new activity. And you might have the opportunity to take a semester-long class to meet physical education credit requirements. No matter what you choose, participation in recreational sports is a great way to find community and make friends who share your interests.

JOIN THE CLUB

If you're more advanced in a particular sport and love to compete, club sports leagues offer organized competition between campuses with post-season and even national championship opportunities.

Club sports are perfect for those who have grown up in competitive sports and enjoy being a part of a team with a similar level of commitment. This experience can provide a sense of community as you practice, compete, and even travel to different events together. Club sport participation typically requires a greater level of initiative, involvement, and commitment, and it may even include an additional fee. But for all of that investment, club sports provide a perfect mix of fun and competition while still leaving space to enjoy other aspects of your college years.

TAKE THE LEAD

Is your school missing disc golf or whatever your favorite sport is? It's not too late to change that. Most club and intramural sports exist because a small group of students demonstrated interest and demand for the opportunity. Make your interests known, and encourage other students with similar interests to speak up as well. Your campus recreation department should have a handbook that can teach you how to start new groups or leagues.

PUT ME IN, COACH!

Being recruited as a student-athlete is a tremendous honor that also comes with significant commitment, but recruitment isn't the only way to find a place on a varsity roster. Sometimes, student-athletes already know where they want to go to school, so instead of waiting for a coach to contact them, they reach out to let the coach know that they are interested in playing. Many Christian college coaches are thrilled to see emails from incoming students who have been competing at a high level. Recruiting is one of the most difficult parts of a coach's job, especially at small private schools that 1 Competition Level

Consider the competitive level of the university's athletics department. Most colleges and universities in the US are members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) or

The NCAA, the largest and most well-known association of the two, has different divisions that allow for like-minded campuses and programs to compete with others whose values, characteristics,

If you already know that you want to pursue varsity sports in college, there are several factors that will shape your experience as a student-athlete. Do your homework before committing to an opportunity that comes your way.

and priorities are close to their own. The largest division in the NCAA is Division III, which consists of mostly small liberal arts colleges, many of which are Christian colleges and universities.

While small college athletic programs may not be household names, they offer tremendous benefits to their student-athletes that the most well-known college teams are unable to offer. These programs are designed for a well-rounded athletic experience that does not impinge on your academic success, spiritual life, and social involvement on campus. Even so, there may be high expectations that require a significant portion of your time.

The level of competition at small colleges spans a broad spectrum. The best Division III and NAIA athletic programs border on elite status and may not consider unrecruited prospective students. On the other end of this spectrum, some schools may have sports teams that struggle to fill their rosters.

In most cases, coaches will be available for you to introduce yourself and ask if their program might be a good fit for you. Even if the recruited competition is above your skill level, some coaches will be happy to have you as a walk-on participant.

Scholarship Availability

One of the biggest myths about college athletics is that participation in a team sport means your expenses will be paid for with athletic scholarships. In fact, a majority of student-athletes participate without any athletic-related funding, but instead, they may receive academic aid from the institution to help fund their college tuition. Schools participating in NCAA Division III don't offer any athletic scholarships to their student-athletes.

If you're hoping to supplement your college expenses with scholarship money, you may need to adjust your expectations. Large Christian universities, such as Baylor and Liberty, offer significant athletic scholarships, but these spots are exceedingly rare and highly competitive. Unless you're already being actively

recruited, club sports may be a more realistic option at these kinds of institutions. Mid-sized colleges that compete at the NCAA Division II level may be able to offer partial funding, but rarely will they be able to offer full athletic scholarships. Similar to NCAA Division II, NAIA programs are able to offer scholarships, but funding limitations for these programs make it rare for an athlete to receive a full scholarship.

You don't have to hang up your racket or your cleats when your senior season of high school ends. But, even if you don't move on to varsity competition in college, your glory days may just be beginning. Countless new athletic opportunities await as you discover and explore. You might find your new favorite thing-and you might be great at it.



HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS DON'T JUST HAPPEN

TIPS FOR NAVIGATING COLLEGE DRAMA, ROMANCE, AND MORE.

avigating friendships can be hard. And good! But definitely hard.

Despite its challenges, creating a community at college doesn't

have to be complicated. You're still going to have people who make you laugh, find an activity you love doing with others, and build a group of friends who, hopefully, feel like family. Developing healthy relationship skills will help you find a greater sense of belonging wherever you end up during your college years.

Belonging isn't a feeling, though. Belonging is a choice.

DIVING DEEPER INTO FRIENDSHIP

When I was an emerging college student, I made a commitment to invest in friend-ships in a way I never had before—mostly because I didn't need to. I was on a mission to find my people, and I was searching for something much deeper than the shallow, hot-and-cold friendships I had in high school.

But healthy relationships don't just happen. I had to actively pursue them and follow through on my commitments. I also had to become a good listener and a good question-asker, risking vulnerability by allowing myself to be known. I had to learn how to care deeply about other people while also caring deeply about myself.

Phew. That sounds like a lot of workand it is! Healthy relationships require effort and intentionality, but they are always worth it. Relationships, after all, have the potential to be one of the most rewarding aspects of our lives, and college is a great time to dive deeper into these important relational rhythms.

10 FRIENDSHIP TIPS

Many have said that belonging must be taught. If you're looking to learn how to create healthy relationships during your college years, keep these 10 tips in mind.

1 Make the first move. If you're feeling eager to be invited to do something, you're probably not alone. Need to grab snacks at the grocery store to stock your minifridge? Invite your suitemate to come along. Want to check out a sporting event or local restaurant? Ask the person you've been chatting with on your way to class to join.

You may not even have to wait until the first day of class to make connections. Your college may have an online community—whether official or unofficial—for incoming students to connect with potential roommates and start making friends. Show up in those virtual spaces before you arrive on campus and you'll already have new friends to connect with those first few days.

2 Take your time. Most healthy relationships are two-sided, but it can take a long time to learn what that may look like. Each person brings something unique to a relationship, and they have unique needs and expectations of that friendship. Even with the weekday hangouts and lunches after class, it may take you a whole semester (or a year!) to really learn what

someone brings to the table–and what they're asking for in return. Be quick to make friends, but take time to get to know who they are.

3 Don't assume. In the early days of friendship, it's important not to make assumptions. Don't assign motives or intentions to what a person does (or doesn't do) based on what you think is happening. If a new friend doesn't text you back when you invite her to go to the student center, rather than making up a narrative in your head about why she didn't respond, just

hanging out, make sure to actually follow through about it.

5 Don't take campus life for granted. Student activities are the heartbeat of campus and often the best place to experience meaningful relationships. If you are struggling to connect with the people you're meeting in deep, meaningful ways, start participating in student activities and on-campus events. These events are usually designed with friendship and connection in mind. If you don't live on campus, stick around after class

compassionate friend. Conversations about politics, religious doctrine, and social injustices can get heated. But when you listen to learn and seek to understand another's perspective, which is usually impacted by their unique life experiences, you'll begin to respect the gift of different opinions. Appreciate the unique perspectives your friends bring to your life. Hard conversations can be gifts to us if we let them.

Bate in community, not in isolation. Romantic relationships are a part of many people's college experience. While one-onone dates are necessary for getting to know another person, healthy dating relationships should also involve friendships and community. Though others might make you believe you have to choose between the one you're dating and your friends, it shouldn't be this way. Friendships and dating relationships can easily be integrated in healthy ways, such as inviting a friend to join you for dinner or planning regular double or group dates. Whether you're dating for connection or in hopes of finding a lifelong partner, your significant other should never pressure you to disconnect from your friends. Rather, invite your significant other into your community.

• Know when to seek help. The friends you make in college might turn out to be some of the most important in your life. But you will have needs your friends simply cannot meet. As a friend, you won't be able to meet all of their needs, either. That's why it's important that you know when to seek help for yourself or someone else. If you are struggling to get out of bed and get to class-or get anywhere, for that matter-something

follow up with her later or invite her the next time. The extra effort it takes to check-in when someone isn't as responsive as you'd like might be what they need to know that you're someone who engages friends with care and intention.

4 Show up. Try your best to follow through on your commitments and show up when you say you're going to be somewhere. We all have that flaky friend, but none of us should want to be that flaky friend. Maybe that means when you can't be somewhere physically, you still show up with honesty: Are you experiencing social anxiety? Are you overwhelmed because you have a paper due the next day and you procrastinate? Take the opportunity to let yourself be known rather than appearing to be unreliable. When you're able to, be present for and with people. When you can't do that, be honest about why. And if you suggest

is over when you can, and come back for events outside of class.

3 Stay open-minded. Keep your-self open to new opportunities and experiences. Perhaps theater is not your thing, but your friend invites you along to a local improv night. Tagging along to an event someone else is passionate about, even if you're not, can be a great opportunity for you to learn more and experience something new. Let yourself be surprised, and let your friends surprise you.

7 Don't shy away from hard conversations. It's easy to avoid difficult conversations in order to keep your friendships simple—but they will stay shallow. Willingness to engage in conversations about difficult topics can be a powerful way to take your relationships deeper. Lean into hard things rather than running away from them. This can shape you into a more empathetic,

more serious than a lack of sleep might be going on. Most college campuses have a health clinic and a counseling center that can provide professional guidance, along with resources for physical and mental wellness. The residence life staff on your campus can also be a resource when you or a fellow student is in crisis. Develop relationships with trusted mentors on campus, such as your residence hall director or small group leader, so you don't have to navigate a potential crisis alone.

10 Be your own friend. All of the previous advice is useless if you fail to befriend yourself. One of the greatest commandments we are given from Jesus is to love our neighbors, our friends, as we love ourselves. Translation: in order to be a good friend to others, we must first be a good friend to ourselves. Our love, worthiness, and value can be affirmed in our relationship with God. This love will help you become the kind of friend you hope to find in others. And don't neglect to get to know yourself: What are your interests? What are your likes and dislikes? How do you enjoy spending a Saturday afternoon? You don't have to mirror what other people do. Know-and bring-your full self to the table.

College offers the chance to learn about yourself and the world around you as you prepare for the rest of your life. I learned so much about friendship in college, and I've learned a thing or two about navigating relationships in a healthy way in the decade since. Healthy relationships don't just happen. But the hard and holy work it takes to form them will serve you through every new season as you choose to find a place to belong again and again.












A SMOOTH MERGE

o you remember merging onto an interstate for the first time?

lane ends, all while avoiding a collision. It gets easier with time, but the potential for disaster is always there.

Transferring colleges is a lot like learning how to merge.

At any college or university, the transfer student population is made up of diverse travelers, all merging at different places in their college careers. And each has a unique set of personal, professional, and educational experiences. Through our work with transfer students at Baylor University, we've discovered a few patterns and best practices to help transfer students have a smoother transition.

CHECK YOUR COURSE CREDITS

Most four-year universities are transfer-friendly, but every school is different when it comes to what courses they will accept from your previous institution. Whether you are transferring from a two-year college, another four-year college or university, or returning to school from the workforce, course equivalency is one of the most important considerations when selecting the right school for you.

Depending on how many of your credits are transferable, you may be required to retake some courses, even if the courses and their content are identical. Before enrolling, some institutions offer online course equivalency tools that can help you determine which of your previous course credits will transfer with you. You can also refer to the college's online catalog for information about transfer credit limitations at the school or in your degree program.

Credit transferability is just one of many reasons to seek out a helpful contact, like a transfer specialist or an admissions counselor, at your prospective institution who has special knowledge of the transfer pathways. Larger universities may have a staff member, or even an entire department, devoted to supporting transfers before, during, and after their transition.

Smaller colleges and universities may not have the resources for specialized staff; however, what they lack in personnel they make up for with a familial environment where faculty and staff are collectively devoted to the student experience. Making contact and staying in touch with a staff member who can guide you through the transfer process will ease your transition. They can also direct you to others (academic advisors, accommodations office, spiritual life staff, etc.) who are equipped to meet your various needs as a transfer student.

FIND YOUR PEOPLE

Success in college is about far more than making it to graduation. A successful college experience means finding a way to flourish throughout your educational journey. This is especially true at Christian colleges and universities, where human flourishing is central to institutional identity.

When students develop a sense of belonging in their college community, it boosts both their academic success and their overall well-being. Research suggests that students' first six weeks of college are critical for social involvement, so we highly recommend attending orientation and other pre-semester programming designed to jumpstart that six-week period.

Finding community may be less of a challenge at smaller colleges and universities, where student life is more concentrated. Larger institutions, however, compensate by offering dedicated programming to connect you with other transfer students or communities on campus that align with your experiences and interests.

WATCH OUT FOR ROADBLOCKS

Two common roadblocks often affect transfer students during their first few weeks on campus.

1 The meeting new people thing. There is undoubtedly an awkwardness and social anxiety that can accompany a new student's

experience. Colleges and universities have student life offices that coordinate and promote social opportunities, but students must make an effort to participate in these opportunities to find community on campus. It takes even more effort for off-campus students to integrate into campus life. To engage in these events, read announcements from your student life office and follow student life social media accounts.

Sometimes getting involved, and merging, requires that you grip the wheel, say a prayer, and hope for the best as you put yourself out there.

2 The different life stage thing. Transfer students are often non-traditional, or post-traditional, students in terms of age, life stage (for example, married and/or parents), or socioeconomic



status, which can also present a roadblock to community. The experiences of this group are almost never monolithic. As such, transfer students typically have more financial responsibilities than traditional students and may need to work when they are not in class or studying. For this reason, community involvement may look different for some transfer students-but it's no less important. Local churches offer great support for transfer students who are struggling to fully integrate with their campus community but don't have hours to spare each week for socializing and student life events.

CHOOSE THE RIGHT SPEED

Regardless of which school you transfer to or from, the academic rigor of your new program is probably going to be different. Ask your advisor questions when seeking whether you should pursue a full-time or part-time path. As you consider what speed is right for you, be mindful of your other time commitments outside of your coursework and have a general goal for when you'd like to finish your degree.

Most campuses provide resources such as tutoring, writing centers, and academic mentoring to help students find success in challenging coursework. These resources also help students pursue positive relationships with faculty during office hours.

One of the ideals of Christian higher education is that the faculty and staff care about you and want to care for you. Don't hesitate to reach out if you find yourself needing guidance and direction during your time on campus.

DON'T TRAVEL ALONE

Thriving in the midst of transition is hard. As a transfer student, you'll likely have walked through more life transitions than many of your peers. Finding your community and making a temporary home within that community takes effort and courage. Identify faculty and staff on campus who can advocate for you, and don't be afraid to advocate for yourself by making your experience and needs known. And don't underestimate the power of relationships and community at your new institution.

After all, friends make great travel companions, so you don't have to navigate the bumpy stretches alone.

reparing to transition from high school to college can be exciting and exhausting. By the time you're getting those acceptance letters in the mail, you've already worked so hard. You've kept a clean transcript, built an impressive résumé as an involved citizen, and written more essays than you ever thought possible.

And now, you're staring at one of the biggest decisions you'll make in your life. Add in the pressure you might have from parents, advisors, and friends, and you've got a recipe for feeling like there is no right answer. Spoiler alert: there might not be one right answer. But there are still

So how do you choose? How could you possibly consider every important part of a college, compare it to other impressive colleges, and know where you'd fit best, just based on a four-hour tour and a quick meal in the cafeteria?

ways to move forward with confidence that you're making a wise choice.

You don't need to find the perfect school-but I've got some ideas for narrowing down the perfect school for you.

Early in the application process, it's important to consider two major factors: academics and financial aid. Does the school have your major, and can you afford it?

While it's fine to remain open to possibilities when it comes to fields of study, narrowing your academic search to schools with strong programs that support your interests is a good start. It's also important to get a realistic picture of what your financial burden will look like. The last thing you want is to wake up from four years at your dream school to a decades-long nightmare of debt. Use debt calculators, including information about your earning potential in your desired field, to see what numbers make the most sense.

While money and majors are two big considerations, here are a few questions to ask when every school on your list feels like the best choice.

CAN YOU HANDLE THE WEATHER?

This might seem like a silly question, but it's not. If you grew up in Southern California, are you ready to invest in winter gear to live in Alaska? If you're from Michigan's Upper Peninsula, will you love the heat and humidity of Houston? Maybe you're even ready for a change, but don't discount the effect of living smack in the middle of a climate you've never experienced before.

Some students want to be close enough to do laundry at home on the weekends, while others may want to pursue a faraway adventure. Consider whether you want a short drive or a long flight, a Sunday night dinner with a parent or a Sunday night phone call from them. While college is a time of independence in general, discerning what that independence looks like for you will help you draw the right physical boundaries around your collegiate choice.

WHAT ARE THE CLASSES AND CURRICULA LIKE?

Weighing the differences between core and open curricula is worth considering. In a core curriculum approach, every student is required to take a certain number of classes from a broad range of disciplines. Some say this gives a well-rounded learning experience and can be helpful for students who aren't quite sure what they're most interested in studying as a major.

An open curriculum, in contrast, has a set number of credits a student needs to graduate but is much more flexible in terms of course options. Fans of this approach argue that students who have more autonomy in picking their courses will be more invested in their learning. An open curriculum is perfect for students who have a clear vision of what they want from their college academic experience. You'll find examples of great institutions that practice one or the other, but one might be better for you.

ARE YOU GOING TO VIBE WITH THE CAMPUS CULTURE?

Outside the classroom, nothing will color your college experience more than what an institution feels like. Do you want to join clubs or participate in Greek life? Is it important that faith is incorporated into your coursework? How do weekends covered in body paint and tailgating for the football team

sound? Do you want to stand out in a smaller environment or blend in with the larger crowd? Determining what truly sounds like fun to you will go a long way to ensuring that you find success in college.

WHAT KIND OF ACTIVITIES CAN YOU FIND OFF CAMPUS?

Campus life is great, but there's more to life than staying inside that bubble. Would you be more comfortable somewhere close to nature hikes or in a city with concert venues? Maybe you're okay with driving a car to get places, or maybe you prefer public transportation. Ideally, your college years will be a time that offers you the freedom to explore new places, start new hobbies, and meet new people. As you build community in the dorm or in your classes,

According to Emsi, a labor market data company, where you attend college dramatically affects where you live after you've earned your degree. Sixty-one percent of community college students stay within 50 miles of their school. For state university grads, that number drops to 40 percent, with a large majority staying within state lines. Graduates of elite institutions tend to migrate to large cities. All of these movements are largely due to the job opportunities available. When considering postgraduate study, networking connections, and career choices, it's important to consider if the

FOUR TIPS FOR A SMOOTH START TO YOUR COLLEGE YEARS.

ollege is exciting and scary and completely overwhelming. As you explore your residential campus or set up your desk for remote classes, you'll quickly learn that there's more to this college thing than schedules and syllabi. Sur-

viving, and thriving, in this transition can be difficult—but not impossible. Spend time over the next few months building rules and rhythms into your routine. These anchors will keep you grounded, inspire reflection, and direct your growth in the years to come.

01 // FIND YOUR RHYTHM

For the first time, your daily life isn't dictated by the ringing of a class bell. You're still taking classes, of course, but you'll be able to work out a schedule that fits your personal needs.

This is your first chance to build an educational schedule that works for you, and as an added bonus, you'll get to hit the reset button with every semester. If 18 credit hours feels overwhelming, you can cut it to 15 after your holiday break. If you're not functioning at your peak at 7 a.m., you can build a schedule that allows you to sleep in or even choose night classes. If you prefer to stack most of your classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays so you can ease in to and out of your weekend, that's possible at most universities. Take advantage of this freedom, and you may find yourself performing better and enjoying classes more.

The rhythms of college life aren't limited to class schedules, of course. With no one reminding you to move your body, eat a good lunch, wash your clothes, or settle in at the library, the work of managing your time and health falls to you. This is, indeed, a big responsibility, but it's also made possible by an accommodating college. Campus gyms often host extended hours, mealtimes are flexible, and the library is available from sunrise

until well after dark. The beauty of finding a good rhythm is that a healthy, balanced life looks different for each person. 02 // DECIDE ONCE

Kendra Adachi, better known to many as "The Lazy Genius," insists there's an easy way to combat the overwhelming number of decisions and choices coming your way: being a genius about the things that matter and lazy about the things that don't. Not everything is equally important, and learning to prioritize the things that matter most will streamline your days in the best of ways.

Adachi's "Decide Once" mantra minimizes decision fatigue and can help you sort through all the questions to come. The concept is simple: make a decision once and stick with it. As it's incorporated into your daily life, you'll find that being "lazy" with tiny decisions frees up your mental capacity for what's most important.

Practically speaking, this decision method can be as simple as doing laundry every Thursday night. Because you've set a weekly time to wash your clothes and linens, you'll never run out of socks at an inopportune time.

Better yet, you won't have to think about the best time to do your laundry every week. It happens on Thursday nights—that's already been decided, and you never have to waste time fretting over it again.

Some other "decide once" hacks: set up a recurring study group for your biology lab, wear your favorite black T-shirt to that early Monday morning class each week (it will be clean, since you've done your Thursday laundry!), or head to the gym on Tuesdays and Thursdays after your 10 a.m. class. By automating some of life's mundane moments, you'll create routines that clear brain space for the things that matter most, like studying for midterms, spending time with friends, or taking time to relax without having to worry about a running list of things you should be doing.

03 // BECOME A GOOD ROOMMATE

Sharing a room or an apartment means lots of hours spent together in close quarters, so building a good relationship here is important. Even if you don't become lifelong best friends, your semester will be much more peaceful if you create good boundaries and care about one another's preferences. Healthy roommate habits go a long way.

The first bit of advice is perhaps the most obvious: care about cleanliness. Be mindful that almost no one enjoys living amid someone else's clutter. Clean up after yourself at every opportunity, especially if you share bathroom or kitchen space. Keeping your desk, bed, and closet tidy will help you stay organized, and it's an easy way to show kindness to your roommate.

If you live in a dorm, the noise can seem endless, but it's still worthwhile to have a conversation about sound levels. If your roommate prefers going to bed early, it's best not to schedule fre-

The best roommates prioritize good communication. By setting clear boundaries and expectations, you'll eliminate most potential problems before they've even come up. As you settle in together, set aside time early on to order a pizza and chat through your pet peeves and preferences. Setting study hours when unexpected guests won't pop in, creating a

Seek out groups and activities you enjoy. Like a garden, community is a thing to be cultivated, and you'll find deeper roots as you invest in your friendships more fully.

As you spend time worshiping with young kids, retirees, and every generation in between, you'll find a beautiful picture of Christian community. Getting involved in your church is also a way to serve others, whether through leading a small group of teenagers, watching babies in the nursery, greeting newcomers at the door, or singing on the worship team.

Become a student who gives back to the city you're in, even if your time there is likely temporary. Most cities welcome and encourage the support and service



students can provide. Walk dogs at the animal shelter, serve meals at your local soup kitchen, or join a city clean-up project. By engaging with your city off-campus, you'll find ways to serve those you may never have brushed shoulders with otherwise, and you'll be leaving your college home even better than you found it.

Finally, don't forget to find a community that's fun. Intramural sports teams offer many opportunities to stay active and build relationships. Join a theater production crew for a chance to flex your artistic muscles. At many universities, you can find chapters of faith-based sororities and fraternities where you can reap the benefits of a social club without dipping into the wilder side of Greek life. Even academic clubs can feel more like play than work when you're passionate about the subject. Finding communities beyond your residence and your major will enrich your social life and keep you on balance.
